

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT BECOMING AN ND READING CORPS TUTOR

WE'RE BUILDING BRIGHTER FUTURES FOR NORTH DAKOTA STUDENTS, ONE WORD AT A TIME.

- 1. You do not need to have a background in education.** Whatever your background, we will train and coach you in proven strategies to help your students succeed. We are simply looking for individuals who are responsible, organized, motivated, and that can speak, read, and write English fluently.
- 2. You will receive training.** If you are accepted into the program, you will attend three required training sessions: a three-day Reading Corps Institute and two additional days of training in the fall.
- 3. You are committing your time.** All tutors must commit to working throughout the entire school year (August through May) and are required to commit to either 675 or 900 total hours of service with the program. This works out to be approximately 20 or 28 hours a week.
- 4. You will be compensated.** Because AmeriCorps is a volunteer-based organization, instead of receiving an hourly wage, you will receive a living allowance for the program year divided into even monthly disbursements. In addition to the monthly living stipend, tutors who successfully meet their program requirements will receive an AmeriCorps Education Award! If you are 55 years old when you start, you can transfer this award to a child or grandchild.
- 5. You will change lives—including your own.** Most importantly, as a Reading Corps literacy tutor, you will provide students with the tools necessary to be stronger readers for the rest of their lives. You will be a trusted mentor for youth in need. You will see the impact first-hand as students begin to gain confidence and take pride in their reading.
